Comrade Bill also took on the role of Trustee of the Enniskillen Branch of the RBL. With all his work for the Enniskillen Branch of the Legion, Comrade Bill received his Branch Certificate in 1970, his area Certificate 1981, for his outstanding work to the Legion he received his Gold Badge in 1985. In 1986 he was made a Life member and in 1990 he was awarded the National Certificate, the highest honour that can be bestowed upon a member.
